Privacy complaints

Privacy matters may be managed in accordance with a range of policies. Those policies include the Privacy Internal Review Guidelines NSW Health, the NSW Health Complaint Management Policy and related information management policies. Where an application for a privacy internal review is made, efforts are made to demonstrate to an applicant the difference between the processes, to enable an informed choice about the management of their complaint.

Privacy internal review

South Eastern Sydney Local Health District received five applications for privacy internal review in the 2018-2019 period.

Two applications were assessed and declined. The basis for being declined related to proper identification of reviewable conduct and the limitation period for application lodgement.

Three applications were accepted and internal reviews conducted. The three applications broadly concerned alleged breaches of information disclosure, collection and accuracy requirements. For two of the reviews, no breach was found. In the third review, a single incidence of breach of the disclosure requirements was substantiated. One of the internal review applications became the subject of NCAT proceedings which resulted in the applicant withdrawing the matter.
